
Business Sector's Participation to "Yolanda" Disaster Relief and Rehabilitation Programs in Selected Areas in the Philippines

All these strong typhoons left the country with thousands of people their properties and livelihood affected.



Yolanda's destruction....

- Category 5 cyclone, 315
 km/h affecting 44
 provinces, 575
 municipalities and 10,436
 barangays.
- 13.28 M people, 6,230 confirmed deaths and 1,785 missing.
- Estimated cost of damage to properties and livelihood is \$1.5 billion (Mangosing, 2013)





- The country received unwavering support, compassion and assistance, humanitarian aid and others (air and sea vessels) from countries across the globe.
- Public and private sectors joined hands to rebuild the typhoonravaged country...

Focus: Relief and Rehabilitation



- To ensure the sustainability of their programs, many of the companies worked closely with the affected communities, local government units and local NGOs (multi-sectoral)
- All of their programs are in line with the government's P170.9 billion Comprehensive Rehabilitation and Recovery Plan (CRRP)

The focus of CRRP and its cost ...

- Resettlement (P75.6 billion)
- Infrastructure (P35.1 billion)
- Livelihood (P33.6 billion)
- Social services (P26.4 billion)

Other concerns of the plan:

- Climate change adaptation
- Environment
- Gender-sensitive needs and equality; and
- Disaster preparedness for future hazards

- Engage the private sector (contributed P5.2B so far and many more CSR programs coming)
- Work closely with locallybased NGOs, universities and colleges and the LGUs.
- Participation of many, if not all government agencies
- Be transparent with the foreign donors (committed P24 billion and P700 million already received)
