

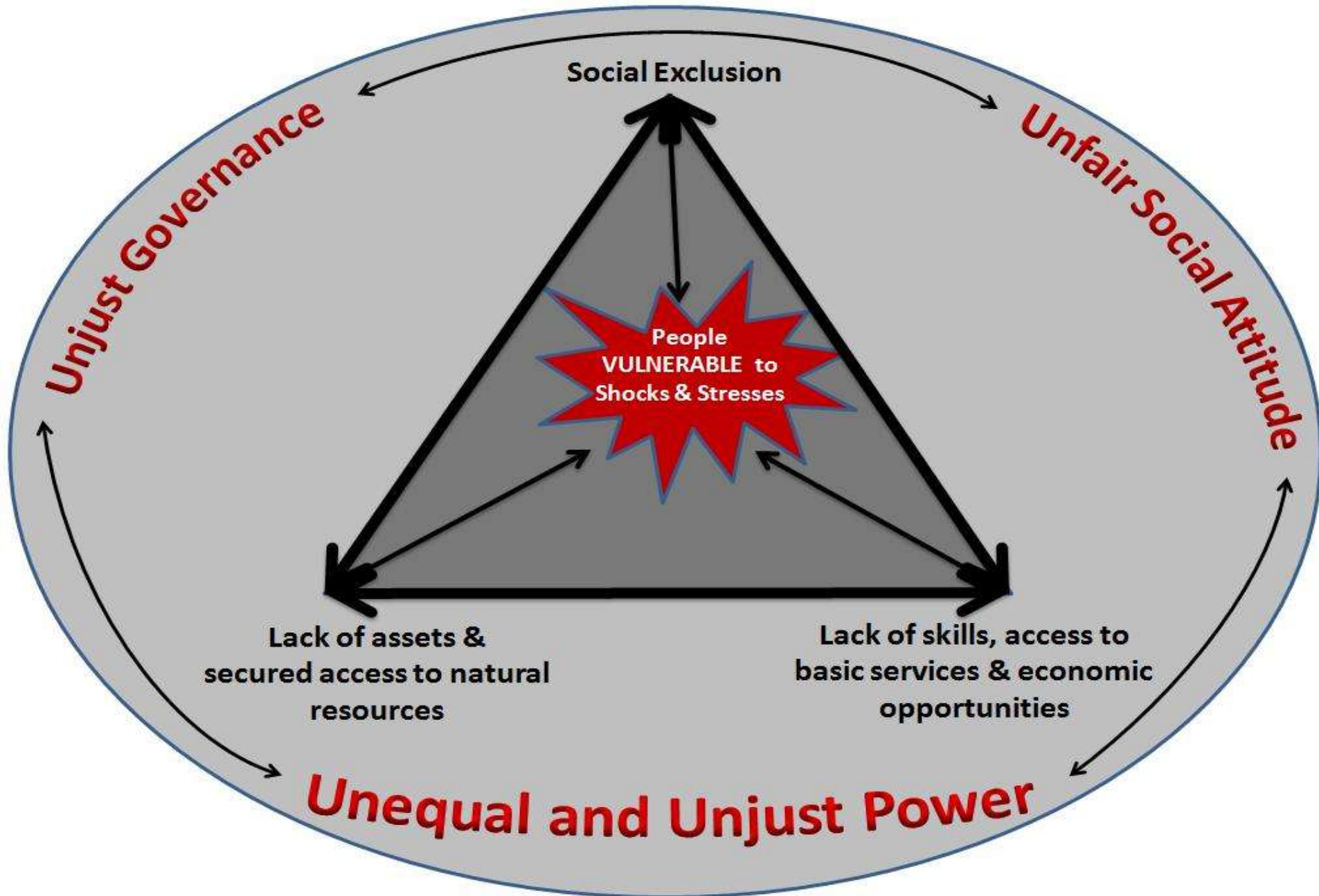
ActionAid's Resilience Framework based on Human Rights Based Approach

Vulnerability as the Challenge

- ActionAid's work is centred around people's vulnerability to shocks and stresses as well as **addressing the underlying causes** that make them vulnerable
- ActionAid's analysis shows that vulnerability is primarily caused by three factors:
 - Social exclusion;
 - Lack of skills, access to basic services and economic opportunities; and
 - Lack of assets and secured access to natural resources

Underlying Causes of Vulnerability



15 (8+7) Elements of Resilience and Transformation-1

Programmatic framework:

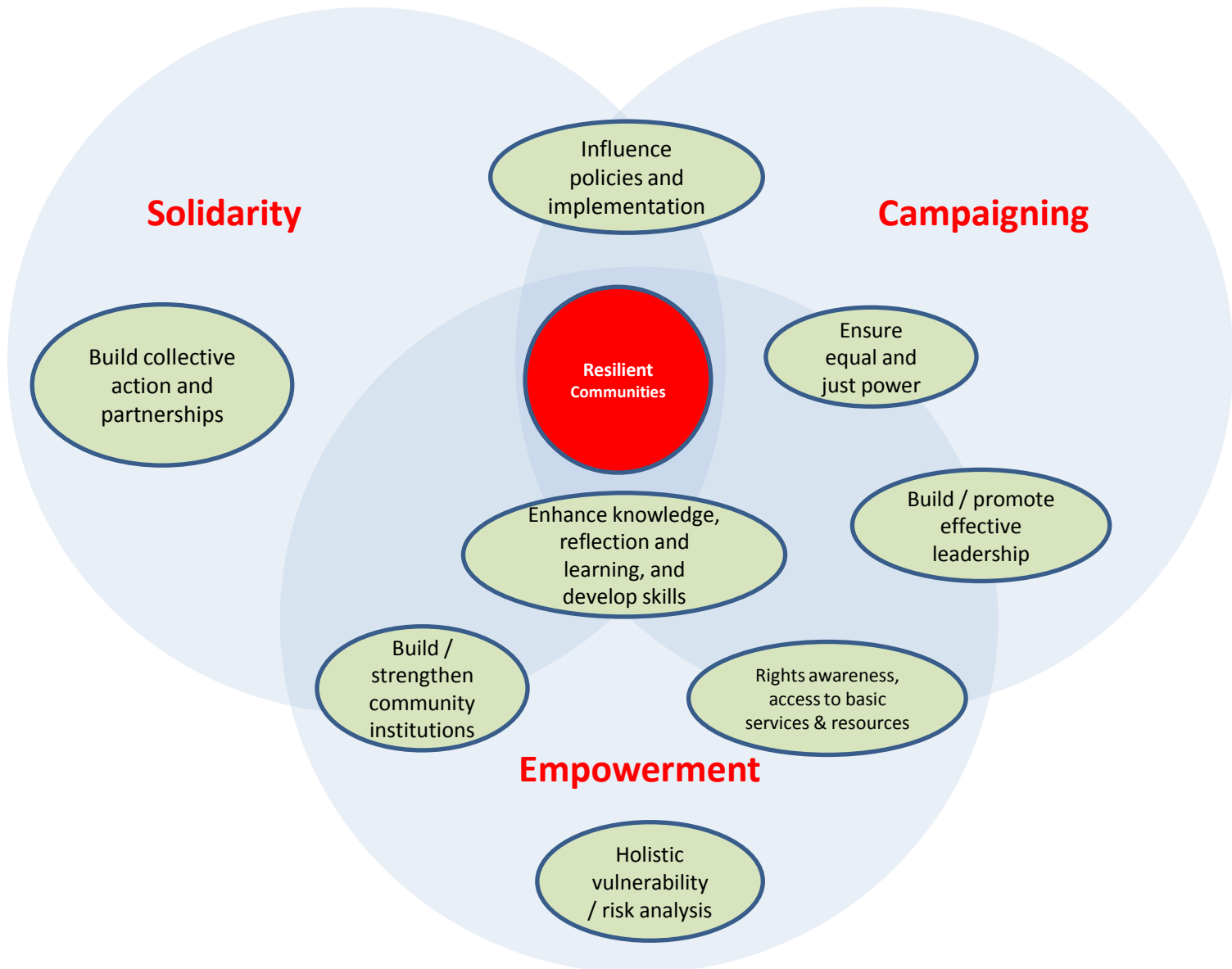
1. Ensure holistic vulnerability / risk analysis, whilst engaging with multiple risks (conflict, natural disasters, climate change etc)
2. Build rights awareness, and enhance access to basic services and resources for resilience building
3. Enhance knowledge, reflection and learning, and develop skills
4. Build and strengthen community institutions for resilience
5. Build and promote effective leadership
6. Build collective action and partnerships for resilience
7. Ensure equal and just power
8. Influence policy and implementation for sustained resilience building

15 (8+7) Elements of Resilience and Transformation-2

Guiding principles:

9. Guarantee participation and inclusion
10. Enhance diversity and flexibility
11. Encourage innovation and experimentation
12. Work across scales
13. Interlink systems and integrated programming
14. Take into account long term and future orientation
15. Ecological sustainability
