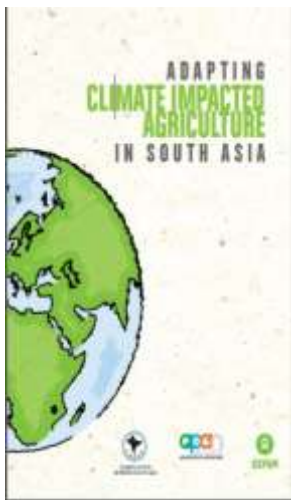
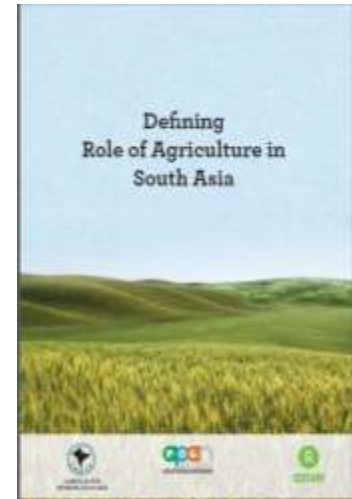


Engaging Public and Multi-Stakeholders on Adaptation



Climate Change ‘super wicked problem’

1. Climate change is regarded as the super ‘wicked problem’
2. IPCC 5th AR infer CC is likely to adverse social and environmental situations that will overwhelm business as usual practices and will persist even after the application of best-known practices
3. Need to take bold decisions towards arresting the GHGs
4. Common but differentiated responsibilities and respective capacities – now in Adaptation is MUST!

Why Multi-Stakeholder Engagement?

- Limited understanding of the impact of climate change on communities
- Lack of in-depth knowledge of climate change policies
- Lack of capacity to review CC policies with a focus on poverty
- Limited capacity to scale-up on going advocacy work
- Inadequate capacity to conceive and implement in a strategic manner advocacy
- Lack of capacity to communicate about the impact of climate change

Owned UP Adaptation

- Empowering grassroots actors with information on Government's Plans to Facilitate Adaptation
- Building capacity of future generations
- Building capacity of media and NGO activists
- Knowledge products: Towards Building Capacity, Instilling Confidence and informed decisions

Stakeholders - *Civil Society* !

- Cross sectoral adaptation activities - joint research and learning on adaptation that is local
- Research and evolve indigenous knowledge and technologies
- Mobilisation and Joint advocacy – to act as peer pressure group
- Grassroot to policy practicers – to build capacity of new comers and spread awareness

Stakeholders – *Parliamentarians !*

- Responsible and responsive governance
- Parliamentarian Forum on CC and Development in South Asia
- Integration of development actions towards resilience against CC impacts
- Enhance Political Will - raise ambition in mitigation that is must for Adaptation !

Stakeholders – *Government Authorities !*

- Policy frameworks that prioritise vulnerable and poor
- Ensuring fair and equitable implementation of policies
- Appropriate institutional mechanisms in country and sub-regional governance level
- Make adequate budgetary provisions for adaptation actions

Stakeholders – Public Mobilisation !

- Create views in favour of urgent action on climate change –
- Active engagement towards introducing adaptation measures at household / community level
- Public opinion decides role a country / government need to play

Stakeholders – *Media* !

- Inform stakeholders
- Educate on latest findings and possible measures to learn from
- Shape opinion of Public & Parliamentarians by sharing information or latest developments
