

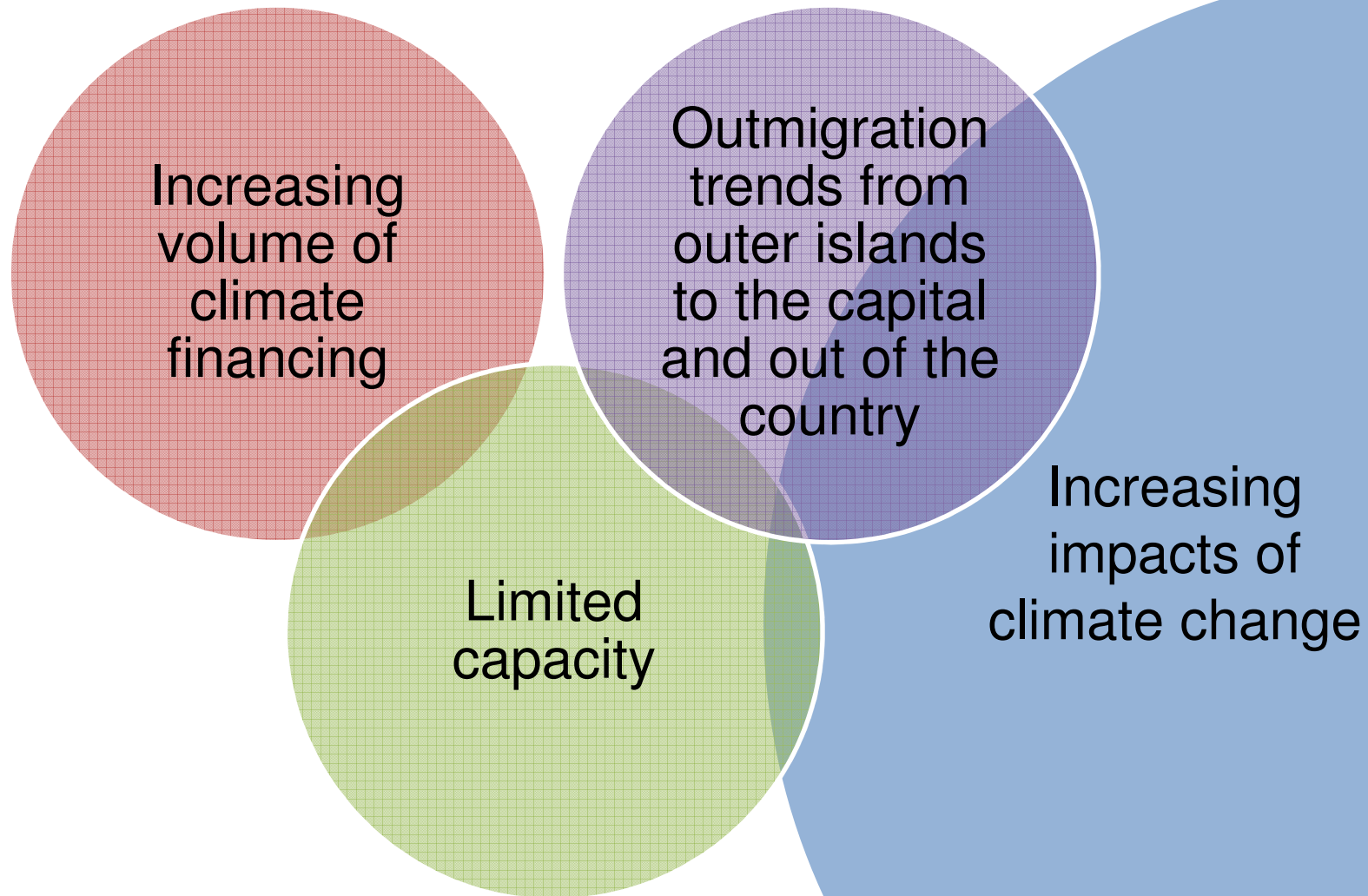

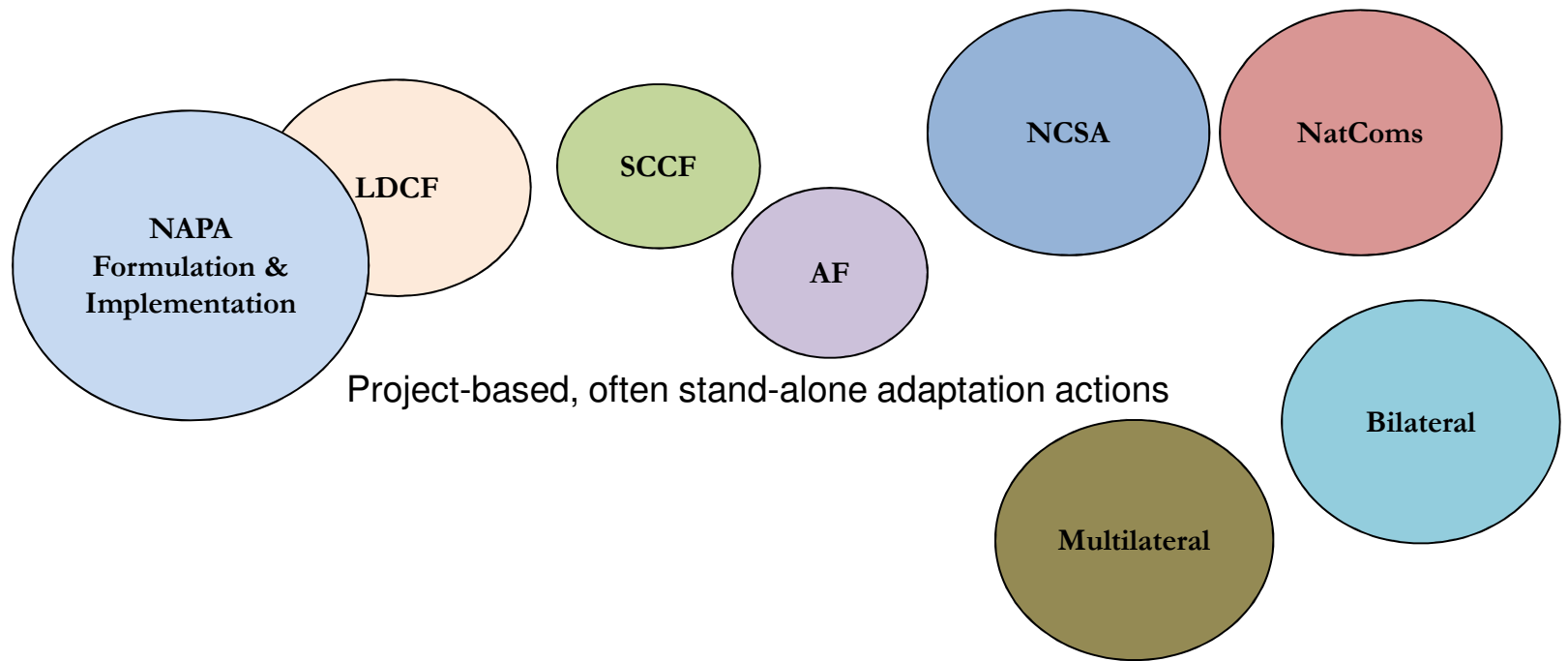

Moving into the future...

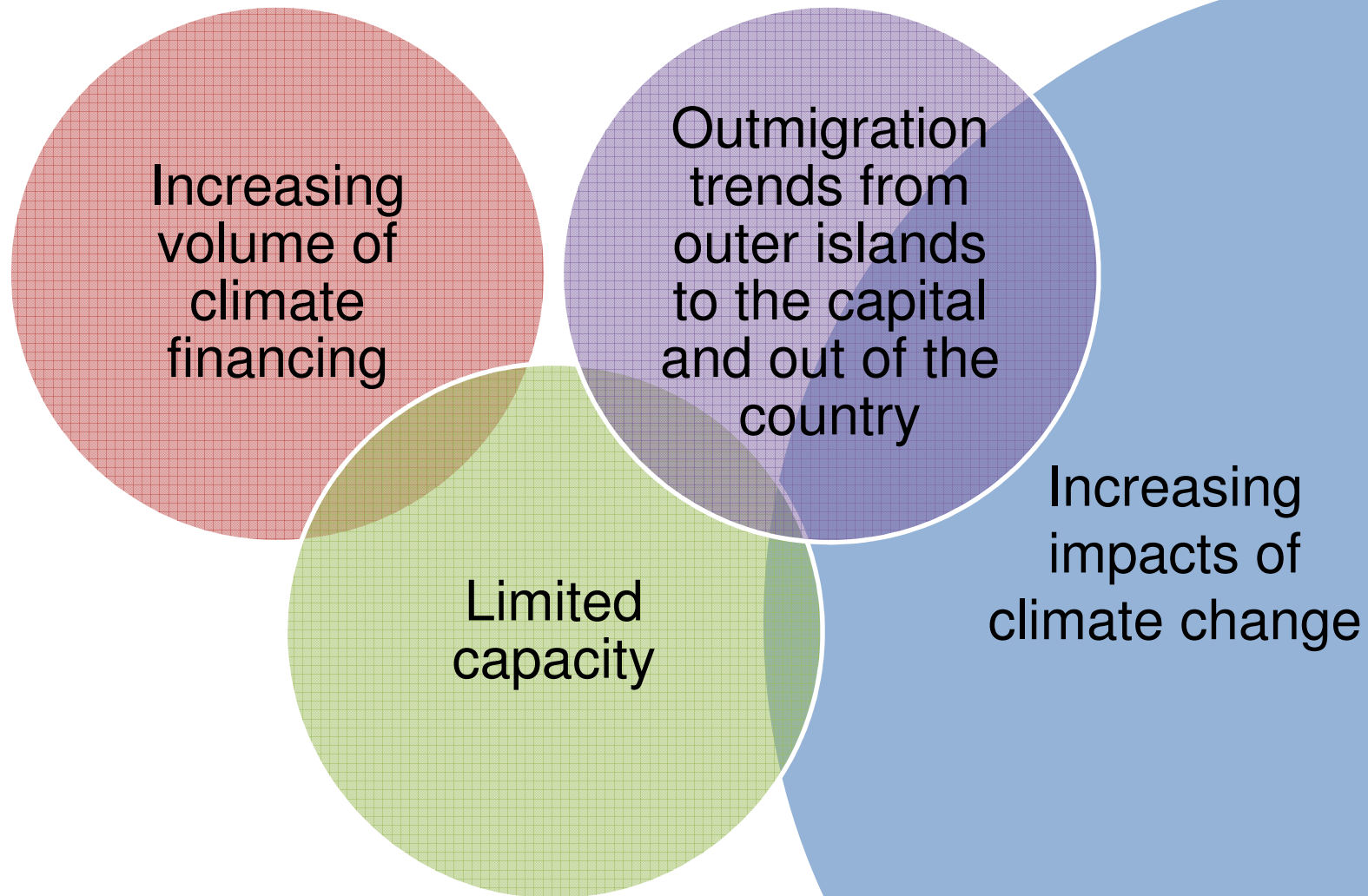
- **National Adaptation Plans** – Country-driven, continuous, and multi-stakeholder process that integrates climate change into the existing national mechanisms
- **Readiness for Green Climate Fund**
  - For handling larger volume of external financing
  - Directly access

## First question

# Is the existing adaptation/development financing architecture benign to the reality capacity constraints?

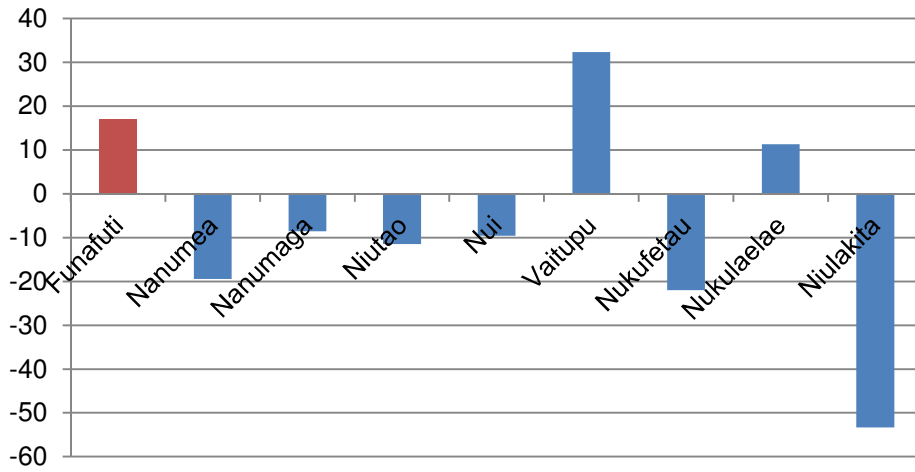
- Many government staff are project-funded and many sectoral Ministries are severely under-staffed
- Adaptation finance needs to be used on “additionality”  
← Derived from the notion that adaptation finance should be “new and additional”
- Under the existing architecture of adaptation (and development) financing, public budget support is extremely difficult

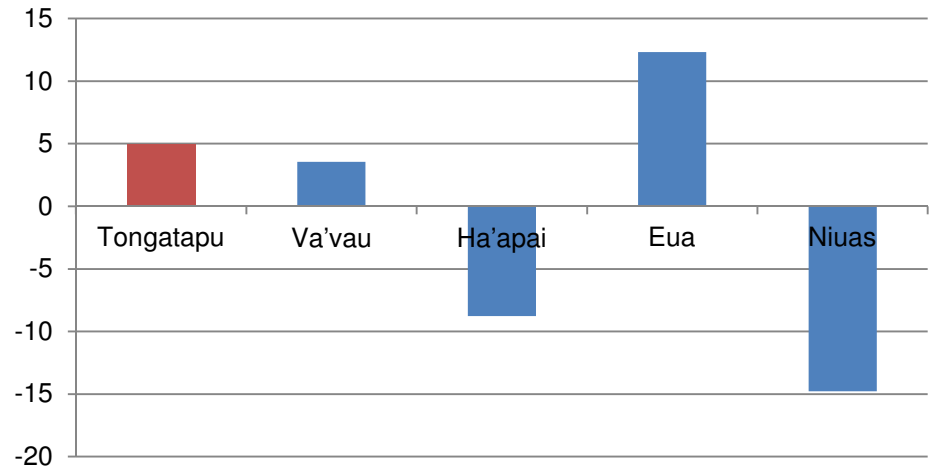


# Internal migration trends

## Tuvalu (1991-2002)

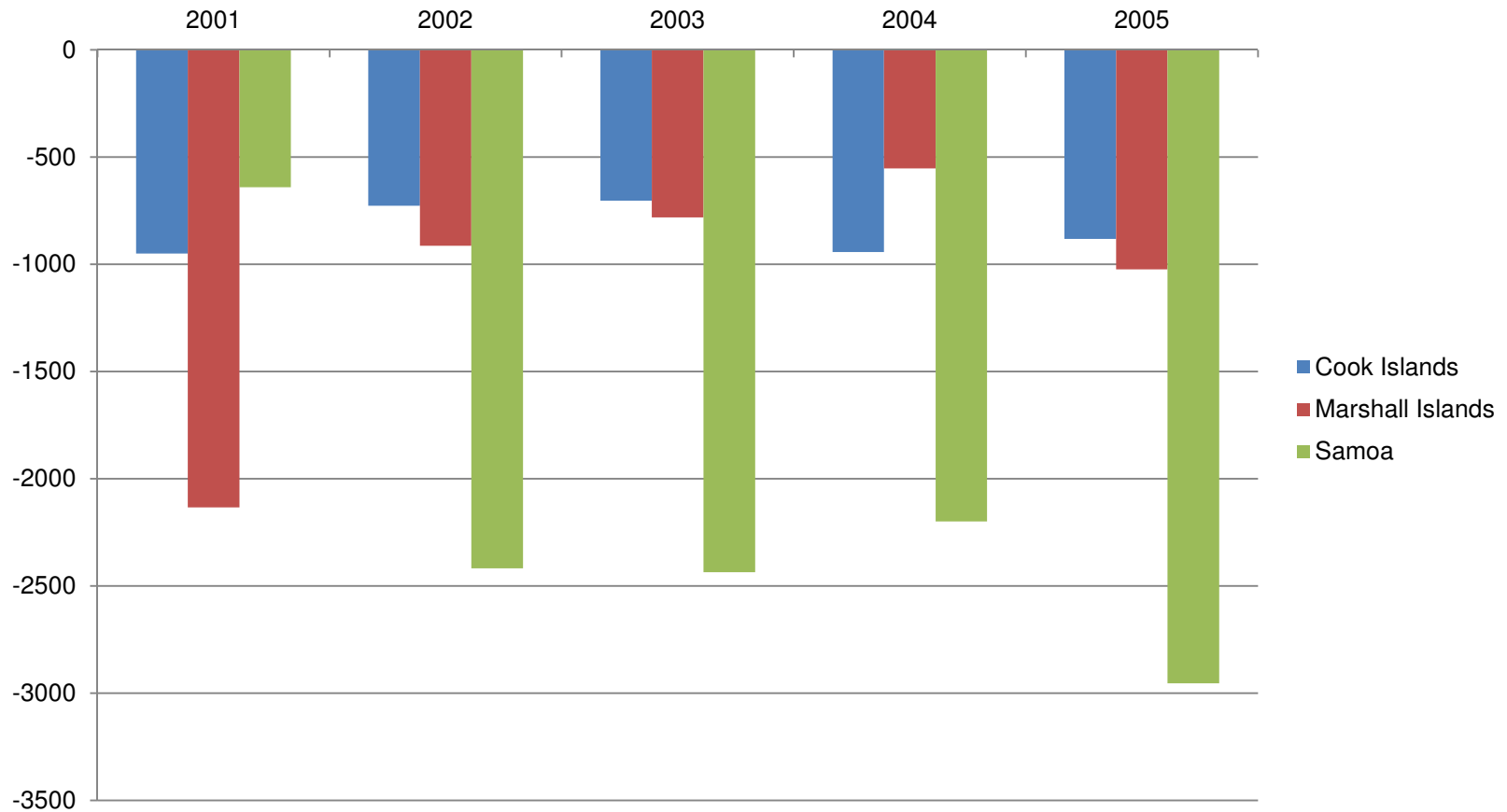


## Tonga (1986-1996)
