# Provision of emergency temporary housing

Our concept is to create a market for low-income housing whose requirements are close to those for disaster housing, secure production and construction capacity, and utilize that market to supply materials and invest human resources in the event of a disaster. We are thinking of a mechanism to supply disaster housing by doing this.

This is because there is no market for responding to disasters that we do not know when and at what scale, so it is necessary to build a market for housing for low-income earners, which is also a social issue, and replace it in the event of a disaster.
