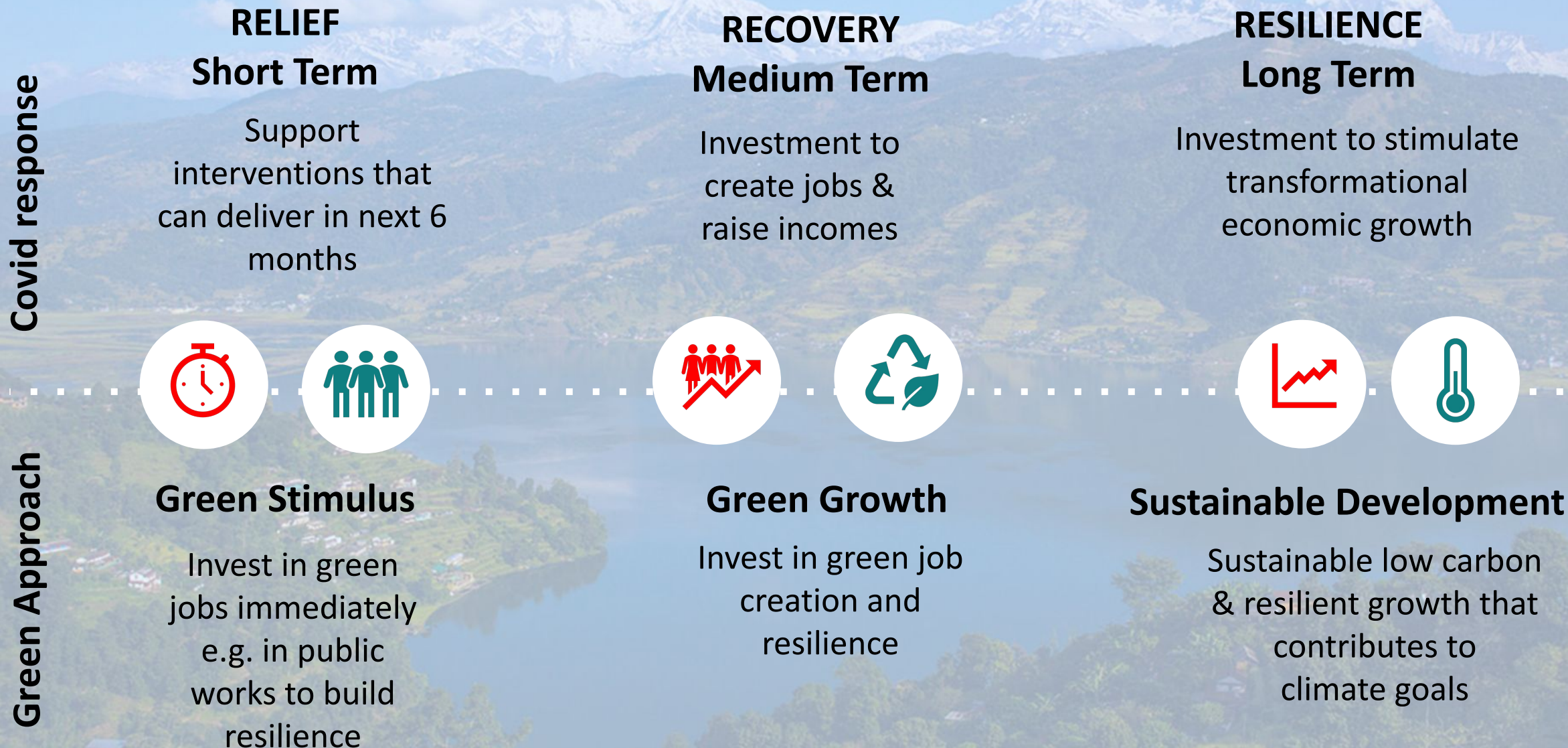

# 2. Infrastructure for clean power, safe transport, smart cities & resilient service delivery

- a. Support for jobs in water, sanitation & public health
- b. Green Infrastructure jobs programmes (PMEP)
- c. Clean energy investment to create jobs (climate risks)
- d. Resilient, low carbon, urban investment and job creation
- e. Pollution reduction and environmental protection, (avoiding Env damage risks)



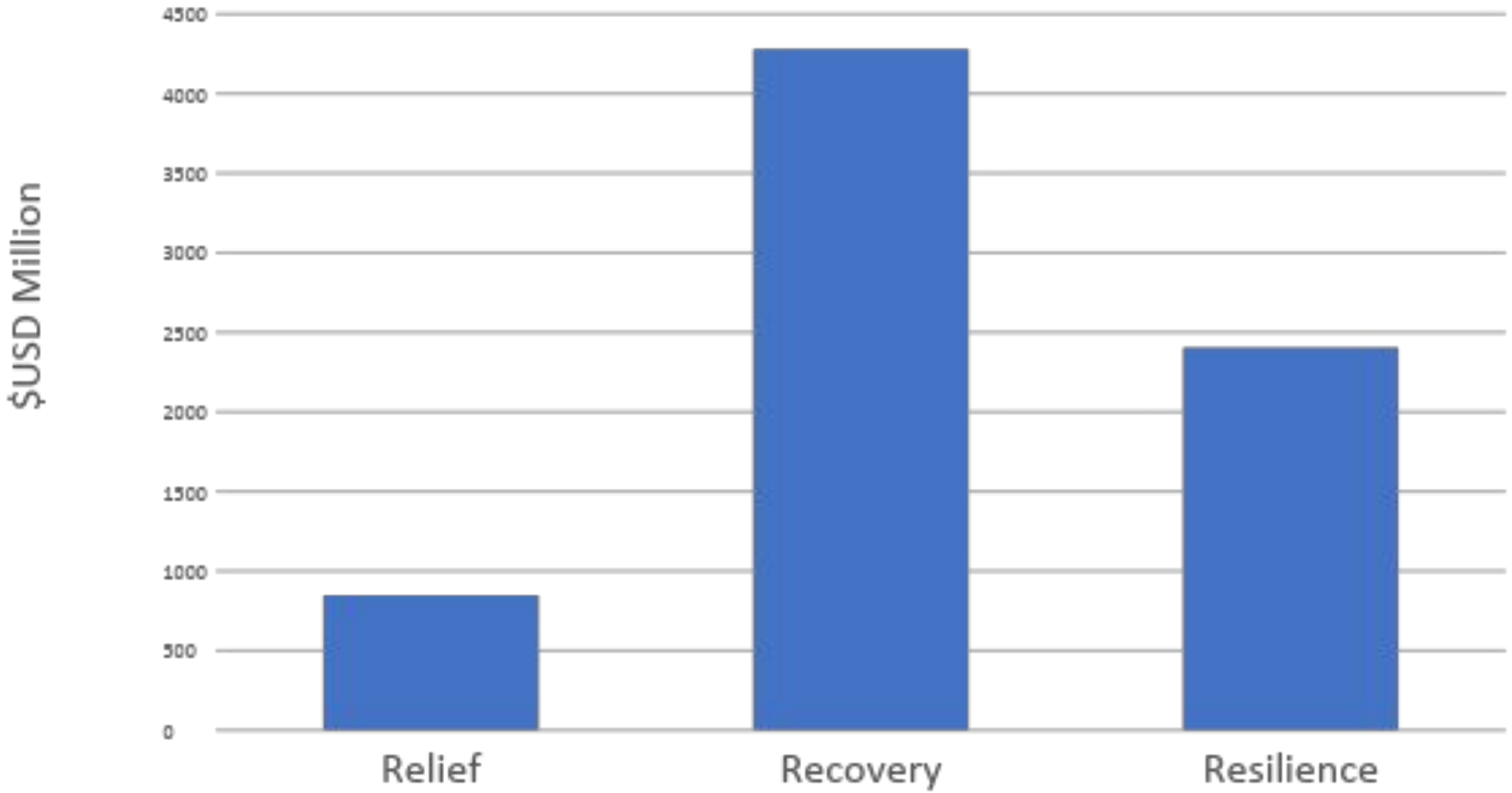


# 3. Reducing immediate vulnerability & building resilience

- d. Using new technology to reduce risks



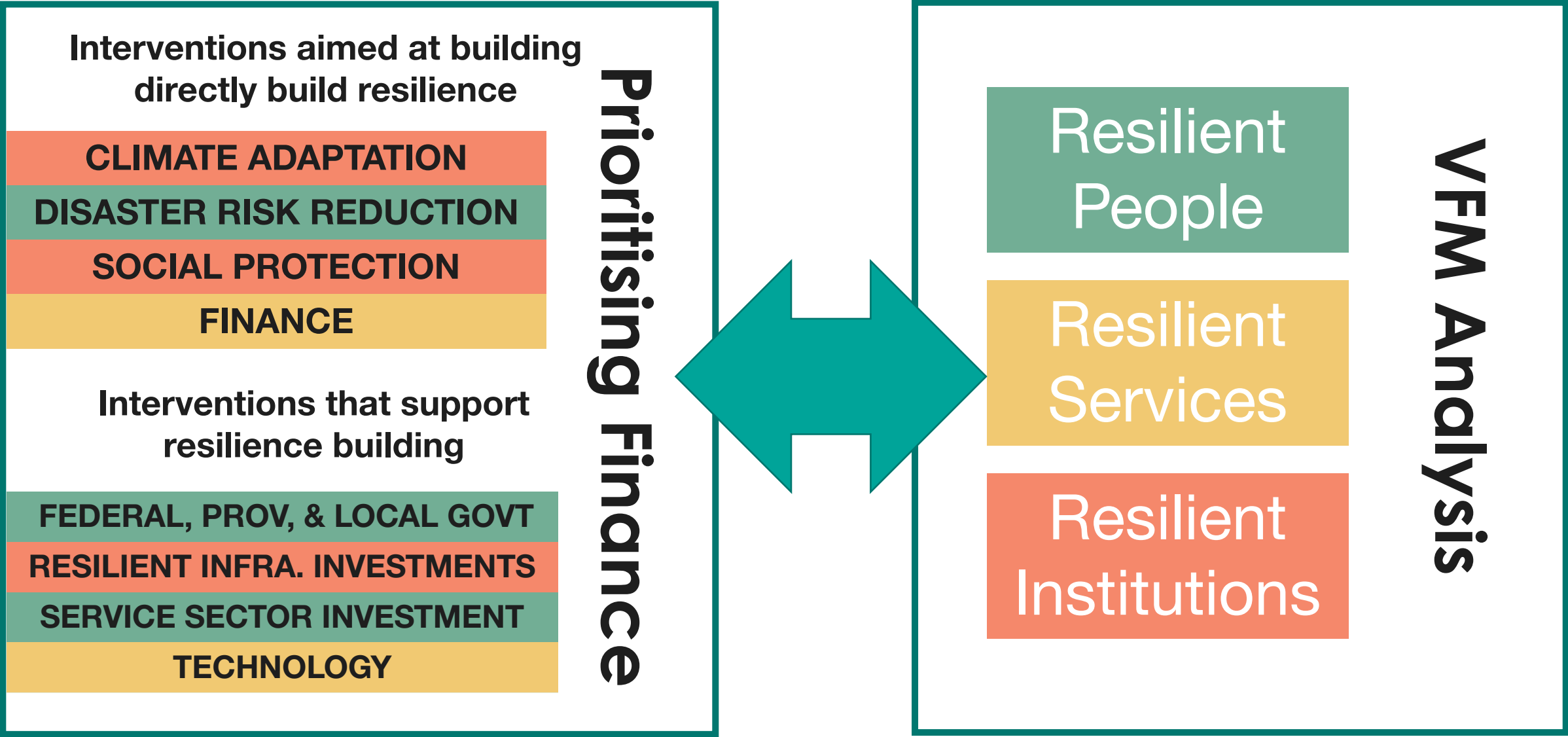







