Financing CCA in Asia and the Pacific

- Vulnerable region to the impacts of climate change
 - Disaster-prone areas (flooding, drought, and intensifying storm events at coastal area & river basin)
 - Developing economies
- Estimated financing needs for CCA in developing countries for 2010-2050 is \$100 billion per year
- Agreement of parties of United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC)
 - Provision of new and additional “fast-start” financing amounting to \$30 billion for 2010-2012
 - Set a goal of mobilizing \$100 billion per year by 2020



APAN's activities related to CCA Financing

Improve access to adaptation finance mechanisms

Aim: Improve Asia and the Pacific countries' access to adaptation finance mechanisms

Objective 1: Assist national implementing entities of selected countries to access and utilize the Adaptation Fund in their project formulation, approval and implementation process

Objective 2: Support countries/organizations/institutions to access and utilize regional and global funding mechanisms

Activity in 2011: Review the report "Current Status of Available Climate Change Funding Dispersal Mechanism"

APAN's collaboration with USAID/ RDMA ADAPT-Asia

Task 3: Climate change adaptation capacity building program

- Carrying out initial training needs and gap assessments for the region
- Establish compendium of CCA training courses
- Scope out and design new training courses
- Identify sustainable training partnerships that fill identified skill gaps in the preparation of CCA proposals
- Explore opportunities for the twinning program interventions (e.g. South-South)
- M&E and database system for training program developed



APAN's collaboration with USAID/ RDMA ADAPT-Asia

Task 4: Technical assistance in preparing funding proposals

- Assessment of existing CCA projects and their implementing institutions and funders in the target countries
- Develop an effective process for identifying potential CCA projects
- Rapid mobilization of technical assistance teams to help counterparts to prepare CCA projects
- Develop “how-to” manuals for tools and best practices of adaptation project preparation
